HONG KONG INDEPENDENT TRADE UNION MOVEMENT UNDER THE NATIONAL SECURITY LAW

Since the enactment of the National Security Law (NSL) in Hong Kong on 30 June 2020, both the Hong Kong and Chinese governments have waged a systematic attack on trade unions in Hong Kong:

TRADE UNION LEADERS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED/CHARGED/SENTENCED

175+ TRADE UNIONS HAVE BEEN FORCED TO DISBAND OR CEASE OPERATION

POLITICAL SURVEILLANCE

POLITICALLY-MOTIVATED CHARGES AGAINST TRADE UNIONISTS

At least eight trade unionists have been charged under the Hong Kong National Security Law or seditious laws.



Ex-General Secretary of the Hong Kong Confederation of Trade Unions (HKCTU)

He had been sentenced to jail for 20 months and has been detained in custody for a subversion trial.



Carol NGEx-Chairperson of the HKCTU

She has been detained since 28 February 2021 and charged with conspiracy to commit subversion because of her involvement in a primary election.

She has been charged with conspiracy to commit subversion because of her involvement in a primary election.



Five speech therapists from the General Union of Hong Kong Speech Therapists were sentenced to 19 months in prison over three children's books deemed to be 'seditious'.
